National School Counseling Week is celebrated annually the first week of February, to focus public attention on the unique contribution of school counselors within U.S. school systems. The theme for 2020 is, "School Counselors: Helping Build Better Humans." National School Counseling Week, sponsored by the American School Counselor Association, highlights the tremendous impact school counselors can have in helping students achieve school success and plan for a career. February is Black History Month, and every year Bowie High School celebrates with several events on campus. This year's national theme is "African-Americans and the vote." The year 2020 marks the centennial of the Nineteenth Amendment and the culmination of the women's suffrage movement. The year 2020 also marks the sesquicentennial of the Fifteenth Amendment (1870) and the right of black men to the ballot after the Civil War. The theme speaks, therefore, to the ongoing struggle on the part of both black men and black women for the right to vote. Efforts from faculty and student volunteers, including Bowie's MCAC, will help to commemorate this special cultural celebration.

Each morning our **student and teacher-led announcements** spotlight various impactful and prominent figures in African-American history - both past and present. Students and faculty alike choose figures that are inspirational and personal to them and share with the campus their impact on American culture and the legacy they have left or will leave behind. Students get to hear and learn about African-Americans who inspire their teachers and African-Americans who inspire their fellow Bulldogs.

Bowie students can also look forward to some pep in their step as they make their way to classes this month by hearing various African-American artists and their **music in the hallways** (specifically A-hall) ranging from the earliest phases of jazz born in New Orleans, to Motown, to the 1960s, 70s, 80s, 90s, and the popular hits of today's generation! In addition to dancing to the music in the hallways, students can also look forward to the **inspirational quotes and banners** displayed around the school to celebrate Black History Month. Each teacher, in addition to signs and posters in the hallways, is also encouraged to decorate his/her door for our annual door decorating contest featuring an inspirational figure in the teacher's discipline area. Students can expect to see inspirational figures and beautifully adorned doors that feature African-American writers, poets, novelists, scientists, musicians, mathematicians, historians, etc. on their teachers' doors for the duration of the month. The **contest for the best-decorated door** will happen at the end of the month when decided upon by votes by a student panel.

We want to extend a big thank you to all of the families who participated in the **Bowie Showcase** last night. Bowie hosts an academic and extracurricular showcase every spring to highlight our programs for incoming freshman students and their families.
