The AISD effort to ensure every student has a Chromebook or personal electronic device to use at school is a tremendous opportunity to enhance the learning experience. However, it also means that more than ever, students need explicit instruction in the healthy use of technology and the importance of fostering human connections. With this Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) goal in mind, **Bowie will show the documentary *Screenagers* to the 9th grade students next month** while the upperclassman are taking required standardized tests. The Screenagers official website ([www.screenagersmovie.org](http://www.screenagersmovie.org)) provides this synopsis of the film:

*Are you watching kids scroll through life, with their rapid-fire thumbs and a six-second attention span? Physician and filmmaker Delaney Ruston saw that with her own kids and learned that the average kid spends 6.5 hours a day looking at screens. She wondered about the impact of all this time and about the friction occurring in homes and schools around negotiating screen time—friction she knew all too well.*

*In SCREENAGERS, as with her award-winning documentaries on mental health, Delaney takes a deeply personal approach as she probes into the vulnerable corners of family life, including her own, to explore struggles over social media, video games, academics and internet addiction. Through poignant, and unexpectedly funny stories, along with surprising insights from authors, psychologists, and brain scientists, SCREENAGERS reveals how tech time impacts kids’ development and offers solutions on how adults can empower kids to best navigate the digital world and find balance.*

**SAVE THE DATE! Parents and guardians are invited to view this film and participate in a moderated discussion afterward from 6:30-8:30pm on Monday, October 8, 2018.** Our hope is that as a community we can explore both the impact of technology on young people and ways to help them effectively manage their use of technology.
