Not only has parking long been a challenge for staff, students, and families, but until Bowie is able to provide adequate parking as required by the interlocal agreement between Austin ISD and the City of Austin, architects are unable to secure permits for the 2017 bond-funded improvements to, and expansion of, the Bowie facilities. Expanding parking is made particularly difficult because of impervious cover restrictions that prevent new construction on any of Bowie's undeveloped property. Thus, the plan for next year is to build a parking garage in the location of the current parking lot to add the required number of spaces, and by going vertical, without exceeding the impervious cover restrictions. Because the **construction of the parking garage will take most of the 2019-20 school year**, Bowie will temporarily lose parking capacity in the current lot. Utilizing AISD bus transportation, walking, and carpooling will continue to be important options available to students.

For those students needing to drive a personal vehicle to school, there will be changes to the existing parking permit policies. With input from various district offices, students, teachers, administrators, parents, and our Campus Advisory Council, Bowie leadership has developed a parking plan for next year that prioritizes parking for staff and Seniors, and provides remote parking with shuttle service for other students. While perhaps not ideal for every student's situation, we believe that the plan is equitable and reasonable as a one-year solution. The **details and logistics of the 2019-20 parking plan**, as well as some FAQs, have been developed and are available for your review here, but keep in mind that adjustments to the plan may be necessary as construction plans and timelines are adjusted, or as other issues arise. The parking squeeze will certainly make next year challenging for everyone, so anything you can do to encourage patience, understanding, and cooperation will be very much appreciated!

Graduation day is fast approaching for the **Class of 2019**. Sign up now for **Project Graduation**, an all-night party right after the graduation ceremony on May 31. There will be a silent disco, bowling,

The **flu has arrived** in Austin, Texas. Please remember that if your child has been diagnosed with the flu to consult with your child's pediatrician to determine the child's return to school date. Persistent symptoms like excessive coughing and sneezing, which spread germs, even without fever, may still warrant the child staying home from school.

AISD return to school policy for all illnesses is:

- Students must be fever free 24 hours, without the use of fever-reducing medication, before returning to school. **Do not give fever-reducing medication in the morning and send your child to school.** Your child may still be sick and could cause others to become ill.
- Students with temperatures greater than 99.9 must be picked up from school.
- Students must be free from symptoms of viral gastroenteritis for 24 hours, without the use of anti-diarrheal medication, before returning to school.

Students with symptoms while at school may be sent home.
