Congratulations go to our National Merit Scholars! L. Cottle, D. Baltoi, T. David, and C. Martin have all been named National Merit Finalists. To become a Finalist, the Semifinalist must submit a detailed scholarship application, in which they provide information about their academic record, participation in school and community activities, demonstrated leadership abilities, employment, and honors and awards received. A Semifinalist must have an outstanding academic record throughout high school, be endorsed and recommended by a high school official, write an essay, and earn SAT® scores that confirm the student's earlier performance on the qualifying test. All National Merit Scholarship winners will be selected from this group of Finalists in the spring of 2018. Merit Scholar designees are selected on the basis of their skills, accomplishments, and potential for success in rigorous college studies, without regard to gender, race, ethnic origin, or religious preference.

This February marks another year of celebration for Bowie in honoring Black History Month! The after school Attendance Recovery sessions are in A-119 with Ms. Pfeiffer, and B-113 with Ms. Jamison; students must add themselves to the posted signup sheet on the teacher's door to reserve a spot. Students are expected to bring something to work on or read for the duration of the session.
