THE LEAST RESTRICTIVE ALTERNATIVES TO GUARDIANSHIP CLINIC - The Austin ISD Transition team will be partnering with the University of Texas Law School Mithoff Pro-Bono Program to host a Least Restrictive Alternatives to Guardianship Clinic for AISD Families on Saturday, April 6 at Navarro Early College High School from 10:00 am - 1:00 pm.

The Least Restrictive Alternatives to Guardianship Clinic provides services to help individuals explore and implement options that are less restrictive than guardianship. The clinic aims to provide



individuals with information and assistance in finding alternatives to guardianship that are more aligned with their needs and preferences. These alternatives could include supported decision-making, powers of attorney, advanced directives, and other less restrictive options. These documents would benefit any student and family who need to continue to provide medical, educational, or other informed choice support.

GARZA ONLINE SUMMER CLASSES - Students interested in taking an online class through Garza High School over summer must submit this application by May 19. Preview the classes offered through Garza Online prior to submitting the application (note that all Garza High School classes are unweighted unless noted on the class list). Students in any grade level can take Health; rising Seniors can take Government, Economics and/or Health. Garza classes can also be completed for credit recovery. If you believe your student needs to complete credit recovery due to failing a course grade, please reach out to your child's counselor for confirmation.

CALENDAR REMINDERS - A reminder that students will not attend classes on Wednesday, April 10, 2024, for the observance of Eid al-Fitr. Eid al Fitr is a three day holiday that ends the Islamic month of Ramadan and is one of Islam's two major religious holidays. Eid al-Fitr means "Festival of breaking fast." Families who observe Eid al-Fitr will celebrate with family and food after the end of a long fast, engaging in prayer and other traditions.
