Student Arrival and Departure

- Traffic congestion Traffic around campus will be VERY congested the first couple weeks of school. If possible, parents should consider carpooling, allowing extra time for drop off and pick up, and/or encouraging their child to ride the bus if on the bus route.
- **Entrances** Students who arrive by car/bike or walk to school will access the campus at the front canopy. Students who arrive by bus will be dropped off at the back of the campus and enter through the courtyard back gates. For security reasons, students should never enter the campus through one of the exterior doors or open an exterior door for someone attempting to access the campus. Starting on Wednesday, August 21, students will be required to show their student ID upon entering the campus.
- Student drivers/parking Only juniors and seniors with permits may park on the Bowie campus or in the student annex parking area at Bethany Lutheran Church (non-permitted vehicles will be towed at the owner's expense). There are a very limited number of parking spaces along Wolftrap that students may use that do not require a permit. Parking in nearby neighborhoods will put students at risk for towing.
- Parent drop-off/pick-up All parents/guardians must enter and exit the campus via the traffic light at Slaughter Lane. The Wolftrap Drive entrance is only for buses, faculty, and students permitted for the

garage. Parents/guardians attempting to enter campus from Wolftrap will be redirected to the Slaughter Lane entrance. When dropped off, students should exit the vehicle quickly at the curb and then walk along the sidewalk towards the main canopy to the main entrance to the courtyard. To assist in clearing cars quickly at the end of the day, parents should text their child to let them know where in the loop they are located.

- **Bus Transportation** Buses will drop off students in the morning at the back of the school. Students exiting the buses must enter the campus through the back gates of the central courtyard. Buses will be staged around the perimeter at the back of the campus at the end of the day. Use the <u>Bus Stop Finder</u> to identify the student's assigned bus. For timeline information about the location of the student's assigned bus along the route, use the <u>WheresTheBus app</u>.
- **Veloway** The veloway at Circle C Metropolitan Park is a wheels-only park. Students are not allowed to walk through the veloway to enter campus. Austin ISD police and park rangers will respond to reports of student foot traffic on the veloway.

- Navigating the Campus Staff members and student leaders will be directing students and helping
 them locate classrooms as they arrive on campus throughout the first few days of school. Students may
 also reference the campus map by scanning one of the QR Codes posted around the building.
- Report to Advisory All students should report to Advisory by 9:05 am on the first day of school.
 Students will find their Advisory class by checking the rosters posted in front of the library. The student's advisory class is also listed on their schedule in the <u>Student Self-Serve tile</u> in the AISD Portal.

Day 1 Advisory Activities

- Welcome Message & First Day Instructions Students will watch a welcome video, determine
 which lunch they have, review the bell schedule, connect their personal devices to the Wifi, and
 complete other housekeeping tasks so they know what to expect the rest of the day.
- Class Schedules Students will receive an official hard-copy schedule in their Advisory class. Per AISD policy, students who do NOT attend Advisory and pick up the official hard copy of their schedule will be considered "no shows" and subsequently withdrawn, requiring students to go to the office and "re-enroll" in order to attend classes. To be admitted to their class each period, students will be asked to show their official hard-copy schedule.

- **IMPORTANT NOTE** The schedule that appears in Frontline prior to the first day of school is **unofficial**! Students will receive their **official** schedules in their Advisory class.
- Day 1 Schedule & 9th grade Early Release Tuesday, August 20, is a B-Day, meaning that students will attend periods 5-8. After Advisory, students will proceed to their 5th period class, followed by lunch and 6th period, 7th period, and 8th period. We will release 9th graders from their 8th period class at 4:30, so they can have a few extra minutes to locate their bus or parent.
- Day 2 and Beyond Starting on Wednesday, August 21 and continuing through Friday, August 23, students will follow the regular A/B calendar and bell schedule, reporting to their Advisory class during the FIT period after the first class of the day. On Friday, August 23, 9th grade classes will be released at 4:00 to attend a Spirit Training pep rally in the Competition Gym until the final bell. Students will attend the FIT class of their choice for the first time on Monday, August 26, so they will be guided to sign up prior to that day.

Stuff to Know

- What to Wear and What to Bring: Although the classrooms are climate-controlled, the hallways are not, so students should dress for warm temperatures during passing periods and possibly during lunch if they choose to eat outside. Some courses may require specific supplies that will be noted in the syllabus posted in BLEND. We will distribute Chromebooks within the first week of school for 9th graders and new enrollees. Once obtained, students should bring their Chromebook or personal laptop with charger every day. It's also advised that students bring personal headphones to access digital content. Notebook paper or a spiral and pen/pencil is adequate for the first few days of school. Students should also bring a refillable water bottle each day. Some Advanced and AP courses may expect students to bring summer work and/or their graphing calculator (check the summer work instructions for each course).
- Bowie Baseline Expectations Bowie's <u>Baseline Expectations</u> were developed as a means to promote
 positive behavior. These four key practices will be implemented by every staff member and in every
 classroom to support campus safety and to help students stay focused on learning. We appreciate your
 support in promoting and reinforcing these expectations.
- **Student ID Badges** Students are required to wear an ID badge at all times while at school, and they will be given their ID and lanyard in Advisory on the first day of school. Enforcement of this policy will begin August 21. Students will take their yearbook picture and have their ID badge made during their English class on **September 24 or 25**.
 - There is a \$5 fee to replace a lost ID badge, \$3 for a Bowie lanyard, and a temporary ID sticker costs \$1. Students may use the <u>ID Replacement Form</u> if needed.
 - Meal Service Breakfast and lunch meals are served in the cafeteria. AISD suspended its free meal service at the end of last school year, meaning that students will no longer automatically

- receive free breakfast and lunch. To apply for free- or reduced-price meals or to add money to your child's lunch account, go to https://www.schoolcafe.com/AustinISD.
- Lunch Periods The student body is divided into two lunch groups on both A-Days & B-Days. A student's lunchtime is determined by his/her 2nd period class on A-Day and his/her 6th period class on B-Day. The classes assigned to First Lunch or Second Lunch are noted at the bottom of the Bell Schedule.
- By AISD Board policy, only Seniors are allowed off-campus privileges during lunch. 9th, 10th,
 and 11th graders must remain inside the secure perimeter of the campus during their lunch.
- Students are invited to eat in the cafeteria, the fine arts building, or the courtyard. The hallways
 in the Academic Building are off-limits to students during lunch because classes are meeting.
- Students may not accept food deliveries at any time during the school day. Parents/guardians wishing to deliver a forgotten lunch must park and bring it to the main office.
- Chromebook & Technology Information Bowie requests that every student check-out an AISD Chromebook to use for standardized tests. The guidelines for replacement of lost chargers and accidental damaged/lost devices has been updated for consistency across all AISD campuses. The first time a charger is lost, it is replaced for free by the campus. After that chargers are subject to cost, or you may replace the charger. Your child's first incidental damage or lost device is replaced for free by us. Additional replacement Chromebooks will cost a fee. Information about charges will be shared ASAP. More information is available in the Everyone:1 handbook and website.
- Schedule Changes If students believe there is an error on their class schedule, they should email the counselor explaining the issue, or go see the counselor in person with teacher permission. Change of mind or personal preference requests cannot be made. It may take up to 48 hours for the counselor to investigate the issue and determine whether a schedule change is warranted. For attendance purposes, the student must continue to follow their schedule until they hear back from the counselor. Students should check their AISD Gmail account regularly for updates about their request.
- Parents are invited to complete the Free or Reduced-Priced Meals application accessed via
 https://www.schoolcafe.com/AustinISD.
 Those who qualify for the Free or Reduced-Price Meal program are also eligible for significant discounts on the SAT exam and AP exams. If you think there is a chance your family may qualify, please take a few minutes to complete the form. The process is highly confidential.
- Medication Information Austin ISD has implemented three important regulations to their medication at school policy for the 2024-2025 school year:
 - 1. **ALL** medications require a written physician's order. Orders must indicate they are for this school year. Prescription and over-the-counter medications will require parent authorization AND a written order from a practitioner licensed in the U.S./Texas for this school year with all the required elements of a medication order (dated for this school year, patient/student name, medication name, strength, dose, route, frequency, name and signature of provider).

- Self-carry medications are limited to rescue medications for anaphylaxis, asthma, and/or diabetes.
- 3. High school students cannot self-carry over-the-counter medications.
