Students wishing to invite a non-Bowie guest must fill out and submit the <u>Guest Approval Form</u> along with a photocopy of the guest's school ID before 4:30 pm on Friday, October 20, 2023. A copy of this form is also



available in the main office. Tickets for guests will only be sold in advance and only after the Guest Approval Form has been processed by the Bowie administration team. COLLEGE BOARD NATIONAL RECOGNITION - Bowie High School students have earned academic honors from the <u>College Board National Recognition Programs</u>. These National Recognition Programs grant underrepresented students with academic honors that can be included on college and scholarship applications and connect students with universities across the country, helping them meaningfully connect to colleges and stand out during the admissions process.

Colleges and scholarship programs identify students awarded National African American, Hispanic, and/or Indigenous Recognition through College Board's Student Search Service. Eligible students have a GPA of 3.5 or higher and have excelled on the PSAT/NMSQT or PSAT 10, or earned a score of 3 or higher on two or more AP Exams; and are African American or Black, Hispanic American or Latinx, and/or Indigenous. MORE NATIONAL MERIT RECOGNITION - Each year students are entered in the National Merit Scholarship Program, a nationwide competition for recognition and awards, by taking the Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT®) during their junior year of high school. Last week, officials of the National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC®) announced the names of approximately 16,000 Semifinalists in the 67th annual National Merit Scholarship Program. These academically talented high school seniors have the opportunity to continue in the competition for some 7,500 National Merit Scholarships worth nearly \$30 million that will be offered next spring. To be considered for a Merit Scholarship award, Semifinalists must fulfill several requirements to advance to the Finalist level of the competition. About 95% of the Semifinalists are expected to attain Finalist standing, and approximately half of the Finalists will win a National Merit Scholarship, earning the Merit Scholar title. Please help us in congratulating the following two Bowie seniors on their accomplishment of earning the title of <u>National Merit Semifinalist</u>: Beck Buskirk and Nikita Karivelithara. We wish them the best of luck moving forward in the competition! All current juniors are enrolled to take the School Day PSAT on Wednesday, October 11 and will be entered in the National Merit Scholarship Program for this opportunity.
