The Bowie Counseling Team will host the **Virtual Academic Planning Night** from 5:30 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday, January 13. Students currently in grades 9-11, and their parents, are invited to learn more about graduation requirements, career pathways, and advanced courses such as Advanced Placement, ACC Dual Credit, and UT On-Ramps. In advance of the event, the counselors will send several informational videos and the Zoom information. Save the date and look for additional emails.

As you may know, Bowie was selected to participate in a <u>staffing pilot</u> with Austin ISD. Campus leaders were given greater flexibility and autonomy to work with teachers to define alternative work arrangements for staff members in response to the pandemic. Our goal as a campus is to increase the contact that students attending classes in-person on campus have with a highly qualified teacher. You or your student may notice a change in classroom assignment for the second semester; however, teacher assignments will not change.

Registration for the **Twilight Program** opens next week. Twilight is a teacher-led program of direct instruction with remote classes offered before or after school for students to make up semester credit from failing courses. Courses will run from January 25 to April 1, 2021. Registration will be online beginning January 15, 2021, at jbhs.org (registration is on a first-come basis). If your student needs to recover course credit, don't miss out on this opportunity to get back on track for graduation.

Seniors Don't Forget! The state **priority deadline for the FAFSA/ TASFA** is January 15, 2021. All seniors are encouraged to complete the FAFSA/ TASFA before next Friday to ensure they will be reviewed for all awards (scholarships, grants, loans, and workstudy) eligible. If you do not plan on completing the FAFSA, we do ask that you complete a <u>waiver form</u> for the District. (You will notice the waiver says "Draft" because this is a new district process that we are beginning to implement with this year's graduating class and will remain in "draft" format until we receive final approval by TEA.) The beginning of a new semester gives the Bowie staff an opportunity to revisit important issues with our students. This week, instead of attending FIT, our students are remaining in their first class each day so that their teachers can share some important informational videos related to the upcoming course selection process.
