**CAMPUS ADVISORY COUNCIL APPLICATIONS:** Per state law (Texas Education Code, §11.251), each school must maintain a Campus Advisory Council (CAC). The CAC is a committee of parents, students, business and community representatives, teachers, principals, and other campus staff who meet to review and provide feedback on the campus educational program, performance, improvement plan, staff development plan, waiver requests, and budget. Bowie's CAC meetings are usually held on Tuesdays at 7:30 a.m. each month. If you have an interest in serving a two-year term as a parent representative on the Bowie CAC for the 2021-22 school year, please download and complete the district's standard membership application and submit it using Bowie's CAC Application Submission Form. Applications will be considered knowing that our entire community is best served when its structures represent diverse perspectives. If you would like to offer your voice as a champion for all students in our community, please apply!

**COVID HEALTH & SAFETY INFORMATION:** In response to COVID-19 infections and hospitalizations continuing to surge to pre-vaccine levels, Austin Public Health (APH) raised the area's risk-based guidance to Stage 5, its highest level, stressing the importance of individual responsibility in halting the spike of infection and severe illness caused by the COVID-19 Delta variant. Austin ISD will continue to monitor local conditions and adjust health and safety protocols accordingly. To mitigate the spread of the virus, I ask that all parents support us in strongly encouraging students to practice the four recommended strategies to limit the spread of infection when they return to campus: wash your hands, keep your distance, wear a mask, and self-screen.

In accordance with the updated district protocols for on-campus learning (click <u>HERE</u> for details), Bowie will forgo temperature checks and screenings upon entry, but we will continue to employ rigorous cleaning protocols and implement steps for contact tracing when necessary. We also strongly encourage you to have your child vaccinated against the virus, if eligible, particularly in the context of the Delta variant's impact on younger people.

**HAPPENING NEXT WEEK:** We will host a come-and-go Parent Meet and Greets on Monday and Tuesday (August 9 and 10) from 8:00-9:00 a.m. in the library. There, you can meet your child's counselor and administrator and ask any questions you may have. On Thursday, August 12, we will host Freshman Parent Orientation Night in the cafeteria at 5:30 p.m. and via Zoom at 7 p.m. The Zoom link will be emailed to all parents of 9th grade students next week, and the meeting will be recorded and made available to all parents. Also, students are invited to see the campus from 1:00-4:00 p.m. on Saturday, August 14 at the Meet at the Tree Campus Preview. **PREPARING FOR LEARNING:** In advance of the first day of school on August 17, students should complete any summer assignments they have for their advanced and Advanced Placement (AP) classes. Summer assignments can be found <u>HERE</u> and on the JBHS website in the Counseling Department section under the Departments tabs. Students should also make sure their technology is up to date and working. We recommend that all students have an AISD-issued Chromebook. **BACKPACK GIVEAWAY:** With the cancellation of the AISD Back to School Bash, the district's annual backpack distribution is shifting to individual campuses. If your child qualifies for free and reduced lunch services, or if your family is simply in need of a little extra assistance right now, we would love to provide your child with a new backpack full of school supplies to start the year. **SENIOR PORTRAITS:** Senior portraits for the yearbook will be taken **August 9-13 at Bethany Lutheran Church** across Wolftrap from Bowie on Slaughter Ln. The portraits will be taken by Photo Texas Photography and will include a tuxedo or drape portrait and the cap & gown graduation photo. All of those clothing items will be provided for the photos and will be steamed between each use to sanitize. For the photo they want in the yearbook, seniors can select from the tuxedo, drape, or graduation gown. You **must** have an appointment to take your portrait at Bethany (<u>SIGN UP HERE to reserve your spot</u>). MANY thanks to Bethany for hosting as Bowie prepares to welcome back students on August 17! Yearbook photos for other grade levels will be taken in English classes during the second week of school.
