BACK-TO-SCHOOL NIGHT: Bowie will host its annual **Back-to-School Night** for parents/guardians on Thursday, September 9, 2021. In order to provide a virtual option, each teacher has created a brief presentation and will post it on their course homepage in BLEND by Tuesday, September 7, to give you the same information you would have received by walking your student's schedule in previous years. If those presentations answer all of your questions to start this school year, you don't even have to leave your house next Thursday! If you would like to personally visit the campus on Back-to-School Night, you are welcome to do so. For those who choose to attend the event in-person, we will offer an open-house format. A general presentation in the new Athletics building competition gym will begin at 6:00 PM, followed by two 20-minute presentations of your choice about various aspects of Bowie student life. Teachers will not be making presentations in their classrooms and will not be able to discuss individual student issues, but they will be in their classrooms from 6:30-7:30 PM to greet you and invite you to look around. COVID REMINDERS: Your student's health and safety is our priority. In addition to being vaccinated, wearing masks, social distancing, handwashing, and self-screening whenever possible, there are ways that we can all do our part to stop the spread of Covid-19. **Should your child exhibit any Covid-19 symptoms, it is important that they do not come to campus.** Information about Covid-19 systems and how to determine when a student can return to campus after a Covid-19 infection or exposure can be found <u>HERE</u> and on the JBHS website. Be assured that attendance-related exam incentives have been suspended until further notice and that teachers will ensure learning can continue via BLEND for any student who is out sick or quarantined because of close contact with a person with Covid-19.

CLUB FAIR: <u>Current research shows</u> that students who feel they belong in a school benefit in a multitude of ways. One strategy to foster that belonging mindset is to encourage participation in school clubs, organizations, and programs. Bowie's annual **Club Fair** will be held in the courtyard on Wednesday, September 8, 2021, during both lunches. Students will have the opportunity to explore Bowie's many club offerings and speak to members about the club's meeting times, requirements, and activities. The Bowie PTSA has planned an outdoor event for Bulldogs & Hotdogs this year in the courtyard and the marching band practice lot.
