EARLY RELEASE OCT 7: Friday, Oct. 7, is one of two district-wide early release days scheduled to allow for teacher planning (see the <u>Early Release Bell Schedule</u>). Bus times will be adjusted accordingly.

NEXT WEEK'S PSAT: To ensure that students are positioned to be competitive in the college application process, Austin ISD pays for every 9th grader to take the PSAT 8/9 and every 10th and 11th grade student to take the PSAT/NMSQT. These exams will be administered at Bowie on **Wednesday**, **October 12**, **2022**, **from 9:05 a.m. to approximately 2:15 p.m.**

- Rosters listing each student's testing location will be emailed to students and posted in front of the library on the morning of the exam.
- In advance of the exam date, students are encouraged to visit the College Board website_to learn more about the <u>PSAT 8/9</u> and the <u>PSAT/NMSQT</u> exam's structure and to access sample exam questions. The <u>Khan Academy website</u> also has great PSAT practice materials which, for 10th and 11th grade students, can be personalized when linked to their prior PSAT scores.
- Although not a requirement of the College Board, students in grades 9-11 are strongly encouraged to bring a graphing calculator to the PSAT on October 12 (you might consider your student putting a reminder in his/her phone). A list of approved calculators is available on the College Board website. Please note that Bowie does not have enough graphing calculators for all students who will be testing that day. Juniors will be given priority in the distribution of available calculators because they are the only grade-level competing for the National Merit® Scholarship Program.
- Students will not break for lunch until after completing the PSAT. Freshmen will be provided a lunch break from approximately 1:15-1:45. Lunch for sophomores and juniors will occur from approximately 2:15-3:00. We encourage all students to bring healthy and tidy snacks to their test sites to eat during the PSAT's short breaks.

OCT 12 PLAN FOR SENIORS: All seniors should bring their Chromebook or personal computer for the college and career-readiness activities planned for Oct. 12. Seniors who have not taken or passed the TSI, or who have not demonstrated college-readiness on another indicator, will first be required to take the TSI exam. Seniors will also hear from Bowie alum Matt Worthington about how to graduate debt-free from college, get started on their Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®), participate in an SEL workshop, and

watch an equity-focused documentary. Seniors considering using October 12 as one of their two allowed college-visit days are reminded to carefully review Bowie's <u>college visit attendance policies</u> prior to their absence.
