Greetings, Bulldog Nation!

COURSE SELECTION - Over the last three weeks, the Bowie counseling team visited classrooms to discuss graduation requirements and course sequences with all students in grades 9-11. During the counselors' presentations, students were provided a digital template to plan their courses for the 2022-23 school year. Please take some time to review this document with your child and discuss their course selections. There are helpful <u>course scheduling resources</u> available on the JBHS website for your reference. Note that a few new courses were just added (click <u>HERE</u> for the most recently revised list of course offerings).

Keep in mind that the digital template is for planning purposes only. During their 1st period class on February 9, all students in grades 9-11 will officially enter their course requests into the Frontline Student Self-Serve platform. Within a couple of days of entering their official course requests, you will receive a verification email listing the courses your child selected. Should there be any errors, you can simply email the counselor to request a change. The deadline to submit course changes for the 2022-23 school year is May 27, 2022.

ATTENDANCE REMINDERS - Keeping your child at home if they are ill or exhibiting any Covidrelated symptoms is important to our ongoing battle against Covid. Thank you for sharing the responsibility of safeguarding all our students' health. If your child must stay home because of illness, however, please keep in mind that while Bowie has suspended its incentive program, state law still requires that students attend 90% of the class meetings in order to receive credit for the course. Students who miss more than 10% of the class meetings (approximately 4 class periods of a course per semester) are in danger of losing credit. Students who miss more than 4 class periods in a course will be required to participate in attendance recovery sessions after school in order to make up the missed class time. Students can search "attendance recovery" in the FIT Portal for dates and times and to sign up for a session. If you have any questions about attendance, please reach out to your child's assistant principal.
